A WORD FROM OUR CEO

Welcome to the latest edition of our newsletter. In this edition we hope to update you on some of the work that we've been doing and whilst it's impossible to cover everything, we hope to provide an insight into as many areas of our work as is possible.

It should be stated though, as I have done many times in the past, that without the generosity of our supporters, we simply wouldn't be able to do the work that we do, improving the life chances of local children living in poverty, throughout the cities of Manchester and Salford. Thank you to everyone who has supported us, so much support received, in so many different ways.

We're now in the first year of a 3-year strategic plan, developed in order to ensure that the charity can provide the upmost support to as many struggling families as we can, in what is and what will undoubtedly continue to be, very challenging times. This has meant changing aspects of our referral system, so that we may work more collaboratively with other support agencies and organisations, in order to have a greater impact on the cause and effect of child poverty. The ultimate aim being to break the cycle of poverty, that so many families can become trapped in.

This year has seen as part of the plan, a recruitment campaign to recruit additional staff or to replace former colleagues who have moved on to pastures new. I am delighted to introduce 3 new members of the team in this edition. It is vital that we are fully resourced across all areas of our operations, enabling us to provide to the most effective service to families across our range of projects.

Family Basics now has an outreach service for families living in the Little Hulton area of Salford, saving those families a nearly 20-mile round trip in order to access this project.

We have seen an increase in the number of Book Roadshows this year, with some 6-9 schools initially identified but in fact by the end of 2022, Roadshows will have been delivered to 14 different schools. With a waiting list for next year already forming.

Smart Start, our school uniform project has continued to enable children to access the school environment. Given the ever-increasing pressure on everyday budgets now, we have decided to make this an all year round project, continuing to work in tandem with our uniform supplier, David Luke.

Childhood Experiences has also seen an expansion. Enabling children to experience new environments. All in the quest to make positive childhood memories and to broaden horizons.

As I write this, our thoughts and planning are now turning to this year's Christmas project. With over 14,000 toys and gifts having been distributed last year, we shall of course need the help of our supporters once again, in order that we can make Christmas a special time of the year, for as many children as we possibly can.

I hope that you enjoy this edition and reflect that without your support, we simply wouldn't be able to bring so many smiles, to the faces of so many young people.

IMPACT 2020/21

As a long-standing children's charity, we provide practical help to families living in Manchester and Salford by helping alleviate the impact of poverty and improving the life chance of local children.

Sadly, even after 153 years, our mission remains broadly the same. One of the most recent challenges we have faced (along with the rest of the world) is the Covid Pandemic. 2021 was a difficult year for us as a charity but more so for the families we support. The stresses and strains on families who were already struggling to make ends meet was tangible. Over the years we have evolved to meet the needs of our community and 2020/21 was no exception.



WE AIM TO REDUCE THE IMPACT **OF POVERTY ON CHILDREN BY;**

- · We provide free items including clothing, school uniform/kit, toiletries, toys, books and nursery equipment to children living in poverty.
- We want to broaden their childhood experiences creating happy memories.
- Working in partnership with donors, social/support workers, volunteers and referrers.



HOW BAD IS IT?

63,410 children are living in poverty in Manchester and Salford (End Child Poverty Coalition)

- That's 42% of the children living in Manchester
- And 32.9% of the children living in Salford
- 3.6 million children living in poverty in the UK

WHAT IS **SMART START?**

Our school uniform project has once again proved to be an essential service for our families. That's no surprise when it ensures that children are equipped with the essentials they need for the school year.

We have provided local children with:

- Non-branded (no logo) jumpers, sweatshirts, cardigans, skirts, trousers, polo shirts and blouses all in standard school colours.
- Sports kit such as shorts, t-shirts, joggers, trainers and pumps.
- Stationery such as pencil cases, pens, folders, maths sets, calculators and dictionaries.
- Winter coats and school bags.

The discussion surrounding the importance and expense of school uniform has been a national debate for some time. We believe that children should attend school on a level playing field, looking good, feeling good and ready to engage in education.

This project has always run on a seasonal basis but following consultation with families and our referral partners, this project will now become a year-round project.

We could not deliver this project without the support of David Luke who regularly go over and above to deliver a seamless service for our families which involves direct delivery to their doorstep. We value their commitment to our work as well as the environment, through their Eco Uniform where garments are manufactured from recycled plastic bottles.







So many wonderful people and businesses have donated to our Smart Start project this year including Selfridges.

Staff from both the Exchange Square and Trafford Centre stores dropped off 3 huge boxes and 4 crates of brand-new school uniform, stationery items and sports kit that their staff had collected. These generous contributions came from staff at both stores, what a big team effort!

FAMILY BASICS

Family Basics, the mainstay of our work, provides our families with the day-to-day essentials that every family needs for their children (and lots of people take for granted!). With the cost of living on the rise, the basics such as toiletries, are not always affordable.

Items available include:

- Children's Clothing
- Baby Equipment
- Bedding and Towels
- Toiletries
- Toys and books

Back in March, we finally made it happen! Our Family Basics Outreach Service opened at Wharton and Cleggs Lane Church and Community Centre in Little Hulton. We took our Family Basics project on the road and our Outreach journey began. This new initiative is a great example of how we can adapt projects in line with need and will save local families a long journey.





SWEET ONATION

A Mum came in for help from our Family Basics project. It was also her son's 12th birthday and as he was unable to see his friends, he asked her to bring in chocolates for the other children we support. What a kind and thoughtful young man.

ONE OF MANY FABULOUS DONATIONS **FROM OUR** CORPORATE COMMUNITY

Stockport technology firm, CDL, who donated a generous £4,500 to Wood Street thanks to a 'comedy moment'. Back in June. CDL rented out their overflow car park to a crew filming a new comedy series. They have very kindly donated the full income for the use of the car park to Wood Street.

These vital funds were used to fund our Family Basics project, providing 225 bedding sets for local children and their families.

Bedding is a big expense for families, and often because it is so expensive, it might not be a priority to buy new bedding when they really need it, especially with the increase in costs of food and household bills.

CHRISTMAS

Christmas, the most magical time of year but not for everyone.

At Christmas we provide new toys and gifts for children aged 0-14 years old, to make sure they have something special to open on Christmas Day. Families from Manchester and Salford come and choose the gifts they would like to give their children from the selection on offer.

Last year we received requests for support from 1,557 families with 4,149 children receiving gifts, chocolate treats as well as wrapping paper. In fact, we distributed 14,000 toys and gifts. None of this would have been possible without the wonderful support of our donors including hundreds of individuals and corporate supporters. Your generosity as always was staggering and once again, we need your help.

Our Christmas Appeal is now underway this year and the deadline for donations is Friday 9th December. That gives us plenty of time to distribute all the toys and gifts to families ready for the big day. Like everyone else, they want to be prepared and have their children's presents wrapped and ready!

BOOKS FOREVER

In 2021 our Book Roadshows were on hold until the latter part of the year due to Covid restrictions but once they were lifted, we were out and about as soon as we could. This year has been very different. We planned ahead with schools but once we started, we've found it difficult to stop! We have been inundated with requests for our school roadshows and our diary for next year has already started to fill up. We hold our Books Forever Appeal once a year to ensure we have plenty of brand-new books and except for the Christmas period, we collect secondhand books all year round and distribute thousands every month via our Family Basics programme and Book Roadshows.

NELL JONES READING AWARD

Nell Jones tragically lost her life in the Manchester Arena bombing in May 2017. The Remembering Nell Foundation has been incredibly supportive of our work with regular donations of books and Christmas gifts for the teenagers we support.

On Nell's 18th birthday, as a way of remembering a very special young lady, 'The Nell Jones Reading Award' was created. An award that will be given each year to the 4 most improved readers in 4 local schools. The children are chosen from a primary and a secondary school in both Manchester and Salford. Nell had a real passion for reading and we want to ensure that her legacy lives on through future generations of local children. The prize is a years' worth of books (12) for each child and a framed certificate presented by a member of Nell's family and Wood Street Mission.

A big well done to this year's winners.

CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES

In days gone by, we ran Holiday Camps and Youth Clubs. Whilst it may not be seen to be the 'tangible help' that is needed in this day and age, it's by far one of the most popular memories from people who get in touch to say that they had support from us when they were children. They recall wonderful memories of their time with us in Blackpool. The fun they had, the laughter, the excitement at going on holiday, to be 'beside the seaside', the list is endless.

The tangible aspect of our work is vital but we firmly believe that every child deserves to have happy childhood memories and that's why we have created 'Childhood Experiences'.

Our Childhood Experiences introduces children living in poverty to experiences that they might not otherwise have. We form partnerships with activity providers, corporate donors and agencies who work with children, to provide free events.

In the last 12 months, local children have enjoyed dinner at The Lowry Hotel, fun days out at Bewilderwood Cheshire that finished with full tummies, bags of fresh air and plenty of exercise, it's safe to say everyone (including us!) slept well that night. In February we had an amazing day at the Manchester Airport Runway Viewing Park. The team were great and so engaging. Despite the howling wind and rain, everyone had a fantastic time. Our Childhood Experiences project is about making memories and we don't think any of the children will forget their time on a Flight Deck.

It's so important to us that we can give children these experiences. A childhood that includes happy memories and adventures.
